Youth Education Coordinator (Terracorp)

Working under the direction of SFTT's staff the Youth Education Coordinator will develop curriculum for students at local schools and after-school clubs (such as Boys and Girls Clubs), with special attention to opportunities for creating meaningful in person learning experiences that align to Mass Education Standards. They will also Further develop and implement the work of SFTT's summer Teen Urban Tree Corps to help reach their peers and colleagues in school and in parallel orgs such as Leah Project, Mass Audubon, Sierra Club, and REEP (at ACE), as well as other youth and nature-focused orgs in the Boston area.

Community Engagement Coordinator (Terracorp)

Working under the direction of SFTT's staff, the Community Engagement Coordinator will develop partnerships with 3 to 5 local community organizations through an analysis of organizations with mission alignment, outreach to partners, and creation of targeted material to engage their staff and stakeholders. They will also create a series of community-based events to reach new participants and provide opportunities for them to learn about trees, engage in tree inventory work, create community-based tree walks, and be part of planting and caring for trees.
